It is a legal requirement that clubs comply with the Child Protection legislation. This covers all people in child-related “employment”, whether paid or not, and thus includes team officials like coaches, managers and even scorers. It also includes anyone who works for your club and thereby has (or might have, at any time and in any circumstances) access to a child or children. Compliance requires a volunteer to sign the statement on this form and lodge it with your club.

Sydney Metropolitan Baseball League requires you to secure these Declarations from your volunteers but the responsibility of keeping the forms is yours. Your volunteers work for your club, not for The League. Volunteers need sign a Declaration once only and then that form is valid for the term of their involvement with your club. Should a volunteer leave your club for a season or more and then come back later, they need to sign a new Declaration. VOLUNTEER/STUDENT DECLARATION

CHILD PROTECTION (PROHIBITED EMPLOYMENT) ACT 1998

The Child Protection (Prohibited Employment) Act 1998 makes it an offence for a person convicted of a serious sex offence (a Prohibited Person) or a Registrable Person under the Child Protection (Offenders Registration) Act 2000, to apply for, undertake or remain in, child-related employment. It does not apply if an order, from the Industrial Relations Commission or the Administrative Decisions Tribunal or the Commission for Children and Young People, declares that the Act does not apply to a person in respect of a specific offence. It is an offence for a prohibited person to apply for, attempt to obtain, undertake or remain in child-related employment, or to sign this declaration. A prohibited person is a person who is convicted of the following (whether in NSW or elsewhere):

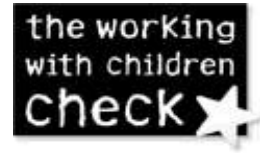
- ◆ murder of a child
- ◆ serious sex offence, including carnal knowledge
- ◆ child-related personal violence offence (an offence committed by an adult involving intentionally wounding or causing grievous bodily harm to a child)
- ◆ indecency offences punishable by imprisonment of 12 months or more
- ◆ kidnapping (unless the offender is or has been the child's parent or carer)
- ◆ offences connected with child prostitution
- ◆ possession, distribution or publication of child pornography; or
- ◆ attempt, conspiracy or incitement to commit the above offences

A prohibited person includes a Registrable person under the Child Protection (Offenders Registration) Act 2000. A conviction includes a finding that the charge for an offence is proven, or that a person is guilty of an offence, even though the court does not proceed to a conviction.

Child-related employment means any employment (paid or unpaid), where at least one of the essential duties of the position involves direct contact with children, where that contact is not directly supervised. Section 3 of the Child Protection (Prohibited Employment) Act 1998 describes child-related employment in several categories including: “...in clubs, associations or movements (including of a cultural, recreational or sporting nature)”.
